

THE CURTAIN CLUB CICELY THOMSON SCHOLARSHIP

Fact Sheet

What is The Curtain Club?

Celebrating 60 years, the Curtain Club has a long history as a centre for artistic appreciation, creativity, literacy, personal development and friendship in Richmond Hill, Ontario. Founded in 1954 with about 25 members, we performed in halls and schools, including the Richmond Hill Lions' Hall.

Founded in 1954 with about 25 members, we rehearsed in members' homes, built sets in garages and stored costumes in attics while performing in local halls and schools. In 1961, we moved into a converted service garage off Yonge Street with a 97-seat auditorium. Then, in 1971, club members raised funds and hammers to create our current facility at the corner of Newkirk and Elgin Mills in Richmond Hill, which opened in 1972.

The Royal Canadian Air Farce, broadcast their first few seasons in our, then new, home in the early 1970's.

In the 80's, we expanded our facility to increase our workshop and lobby spaces and in 2009, we took on a \$1.2 million dollar expansion and renovation to update our theatre for accessibility, washrooms, kitchen and improved heating and air conditioning systems.

The club has long been a proud supporter of the Theatre Ontario Festival having most recently participated over the past decade with: The December Man (l'homme de Decembre) (Sault St. Marie 2012); Proof (Sarnia, 2006); Marvin's Room (Belleville, 2005- awarded Outstanding Festival Production); Staff Room (Sault Ste. Marie, 2004 -awarded Outstanding Festival Production); Filthy Rich (Oshawa, 2003). We have also hosted the Festival twice: The first time in 1999 using the Newmarket Theatre and most recently in 2011 using the new Richmond Hill Centre for the Performing Arts.

What is The Curtain Club Cicely Thomson Scholarship?

The purpose of The Curtain Club Cicely Thomson Scholarship, is to encourage and promote the attainment of higher educational goals in "The Arts" for individuals who have demonstrated a high level of academic achievement, have made a positive contribution to their school through involvement in extracurricular activities and have made significant contributions of time and energy to community service programs.

The Curtain Club Cicely Thomson Scholarship is a long-term, ongoing initiative funded by **The Curtain Club**. It annually awards one-year scholarships of \$500 to recipients who live in Richmond Hill. The number of scholarships is determined annually by the Curtain Club's Executive Committee. The Appointee in charge of the administration of the Scholarship is Joan Burrows.

Who is Eligible?

Students who reside in Richmond Hill and are enrolled full time at an accredited secondary school, currently in their graduating year of high school who will be attending a post-secondary institution in the Fall to pursue a course of study leading to a degree or diploma in the arts (with a preference to Dramatic/Theatre Arts) from the accredited community college or university of their choice. Applicants must obtain a Secondary School Diploma.

What are the Selection Criteria?

In addition to the candidate's academic abilities, the Executive Committee will evaluate the candidate's contribution to their school and their community through their involvement in extracurricular activities. Contributions to the community may be demonstrated by involvement in local clubs, organizations and community activities.

Who was Cicely Thomson?

The late Cicely Thomson was a founding member of The Curtain Club (1954) and accomplished actor and director. Founding member and one of the first directors of Theatre Ontario (1971) dedicated to the development and maintenance of high quality theatre in all parts of the province that is accessible to and reflects all segments of our society. Cicely passed away on August 22, 2005.

What is the timing?

Each year The Curtain Club Cicely Thomson Scholarship programme is launched on October 1st. All applications must be submitted by January 31st of the following year. Note, packages "post-marked" after January 31st will not be accepted. Proof of acceptance at an accredited post-secondary institution in a program that meets the criteria must be submitted separately and received no later than April 30th. Recipients are notified via mail and/or phone in late May of each year.
